FROM THE PRESIDENT

Each chapter of her book is complete in itself so doesn't have to be read chronologically.

"Syria's Secret Library" by Mike Thomas, an English journalist who had worked in the worst war-torn places for over a decade was a harrowing read. The senseless bombings, starvation, lack of medicine and hospital care, lack of clean water and disruptive power supply was soul destroying. Despite all this, Mike was able to make intermittent contact with some young rebels in Daraya, Syria who managed over the years to set up an underground library which grew to have over 15,000 titles, which were lovingly cleaned, repaired and catalogued with name of owner (if possible) and address where found amongst the bombed buildings. The library became a sanctuary where trusted people could read for enjoyment or study. Classes were formed and it brought joy and hope to many.

DUNLUCE CASTLE VISIT

On Monday 27th June, 16 members braved the cold morning and ventured down to Brighton and visited historic home, Dunluce Castle.

Dunluce is a private residence, being maintained in the style of its origins – building commenced in 1904 and it was inhabited in 1910 by the Macully family. There have been seven owners of the property in total. We were warmly welcomed by the current owner, Sarah, whose husband was a local lad who always said he would buy the house someday! Many years later, his dream came true.

We were then ushered into a lovely, period dining room for a morning tea of scones, jam and cream, tea and coffee. Sarah had many fascinating stories to tell about the collection of furniture, art work and antiques on display in the dining room and around the house, many of them donations from well-wishers.

A pictorial presentation on the history of the Macully family, their descendants, and the Brighton surrounds of the 1920's was a wonderful insight into life in that era. The morning finished with a tour of the upstairs bedrooms, and the surrounding balcony, with more stories of the acquisition of the period pieces that decorate these areas, and the work that Sarah has done to make the house such a wonderful representation of times gone by.

RECYCLING BOXES

You will notice that there are 4 boxes in the foyer for recycling particular items.

PLASTIC BREAD TAGS - will be sent to Robe to be made into bowls

PENS etc - felt tip pens, biros, batteries, mobile phones, ink cartridges will go to Office works (Batteries & mobile phones can also be left in a bin at Woollies).

ORAL HYGIENE - are posted free to Colgate. Toothbrushes, brushes only from electric toothbrushes, Interdental brushes, floss containers, washed out toothpaste tubes with the lid on. (Cut off the bottom of the tube for easier cleaning).

BLISTER PILL PACKETS - will be sent to Terry White Pharmacy in Melbourne Street, North Adelaide.

Recycling information about other items.

- Any soft plastic can be taken to the supermarkets, this includes biscuit wrappers.
- Only Glad, Coles or Woolworths Essential cling wrap can be recycled (returned to supermarket). Others go in landfill bin.
- Any foil including foil lolly wrappers are to be squashed into a ball about the size of a tennis ball and then put into your recycling bin.
- Plastic lids must be put into a plastic container with a tight-fitting lid. A plastic milk bottle with a flap cut high on one side is a good way to do this.
- Metal lids (e.g. tuna cans) need to be in a metal container. The lid can be washed with the tin then placed inside the tin & the sides slightly squashed to keep it there before putting in your recycle bin.
