Guest Speaker Program

After the forced COVID19 break our Guest Speaker Program returned with members needing to book to attend as our numbers are now limited to 45 per session. We resumed our Tuesday Guest Speaker program from 1st September, and we have been educated, enlightened and entertained by some wonderful people who generously gave up their time to speak to us.

Sept 1: Jason Tanner from SARDI spoke on the coastal seagrass decline in Spencer Gulf and the efforts underway to regenerate the sea grass, and how he and his small team, located at West Beach, are working to restore the diminished seagrasses along our coastline.

Sept 8: Sandy Whitelaw in costume and with mannequins told us about the History and Fashions of the Flappers in the 1920s.

Sept 15: Following our delayed AGM, Brevet Sergeant Shaun Pearce from Henley Beach Police Station informed us of Cyber Safety and how to avoid scams.

Sept 22: Barry Jennings, former Lawyer, Judge and Mentor informed us about some of his cases and also some recent notable cases in our court system and explained various aspects of the law during his long association with the Law.

Oct 13: The ever popular Don Hopgood presented a thought provoking History – What Is It? He also told us how he and his brother published their own history of Jazz in SA 1918-2000.

Oct 20: Sandy Whitelaw returned dressed as suffragette Mary Lee to tell us of that lady's struggle to obtain the vote for women in SA.

Oct 27: Ian Henschke, Chief Advocate of Seniors Australia talked about his role as seniors' advocate, the Royal Commission and also his early career including time at Oxford.

Nov 3: Our Vice-President, Jennifer Brown informed and entertained us with a snapshot of her learning of Australia while travelling in a Caravan.

Nov 10: Sue Garforth continued with Royal Marriage disasters with an insight into the history of the marriage of George IV and Princess Caroline, likening some of their life to more recent royals.

AYERS HOUSE: On Friday, 18th September, 13 members attended a private tour of Ayers House, North Terrace. It is considered Adelaide's finest Victorian-era home and one of the last remaining grand 19th century residences on North Terrace. It is now a museum managed by the National Trust of SA. It consists of more than 40 rooms over a two acre property. Ably led by Graeme Fanning and Sandy Whitelaw (speakers at some of our regular meetings) we learned the history of the house and viewed the period items on display. Sandy manages the historic costume collection held at Ayers House, and at the time of our tour she had mounted a display showing the clothing worn by several entertainers from past eras - Sarah Bernhardt, Lola Montez, Anna Pavlova, Dame Nellie Melba, and Gladys Moncrieff. Sandy presented an entertaining talk about each of these interesting women.

Automated External Defibrillator

As you are all aware an Automated External Defibrillator or AED was purchased for use in the event that a member or visitor collapsed while at U3A, and is mounted on the wall for easy access.
